



## CEDARBRAE COLLEGIATE INSTITUTE COURSE SELECTION 2019-2020 For Students Moving from Grade 10 to Grade 11

### MAKING CHOICES

**Students moving from Grade 10 to Grade 11 must choose a total of 8 courses and 3 alternatives.**

**NOTE:** You must have earned **23** credits before a spare can be added to your timetable. You have **2** compulsory courses to select this year, **3** if you are an Immersion or Extended French student. The remaining courses are electives chosen because of a specific post-secondary destination and/or because you enjoy that subject.

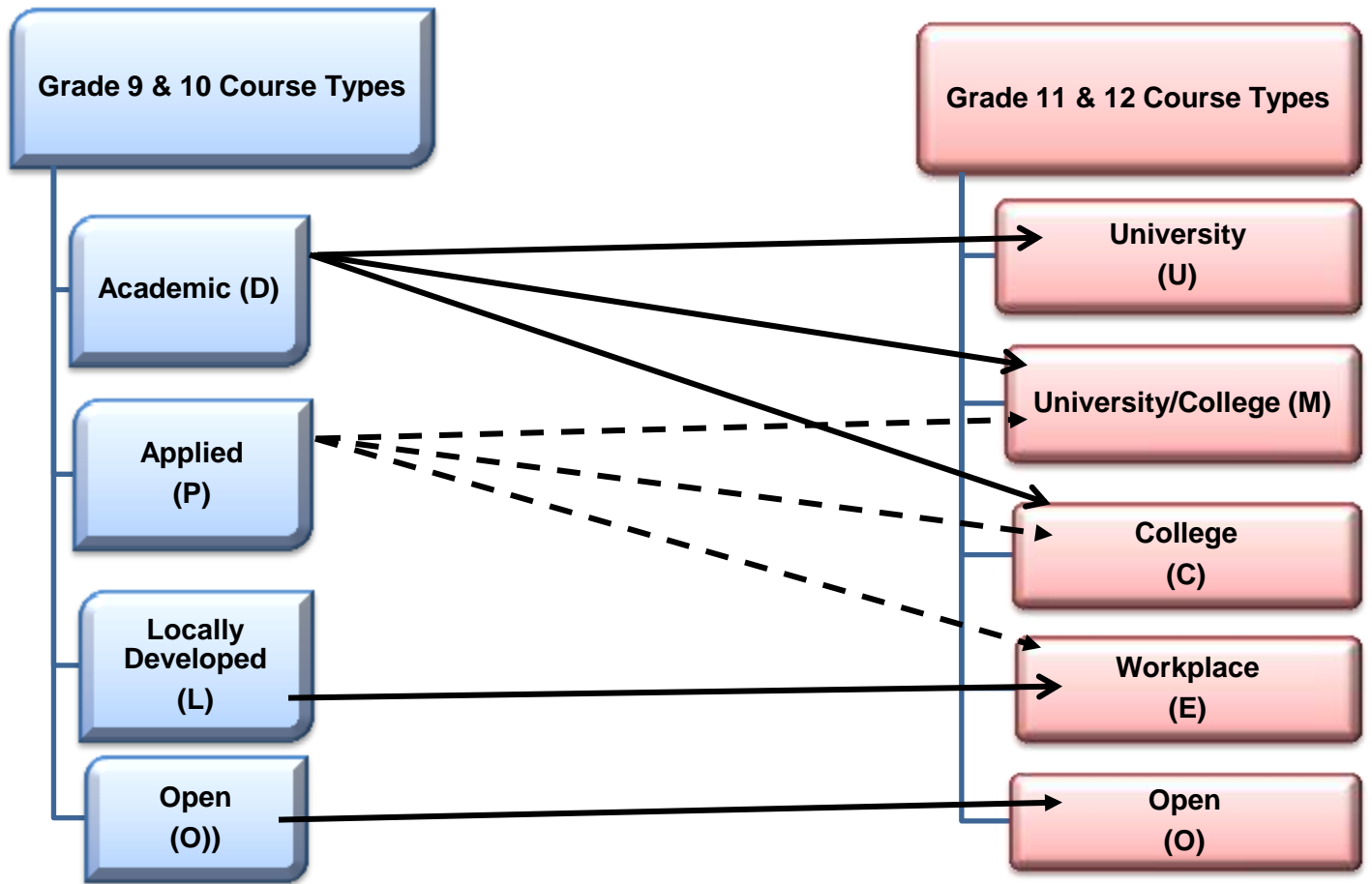
When choosing the codes for your compulsory courses keep in mind that the **5th and bolded** letter in each of the codes listed above indicates the **PATHWAY**, for which these courses are designed to prepare you, following high school. **U** - University, **M** - Mixed for both college and university, **C** - College, **E** - Workplace. Make sure you have the prerequisite for the courses you are choosing.

**If a student fails a grade 10 core course (English, Math, Science, History, Civics, Careers) then they need to put this into their timetable for next year. If they have a mark between 35 – 45% they can sign up for summer school and when guidance knows that the student has passed summer school guidance will change their timetable for next year (i.e. put in the appropriate grade 10 course)**

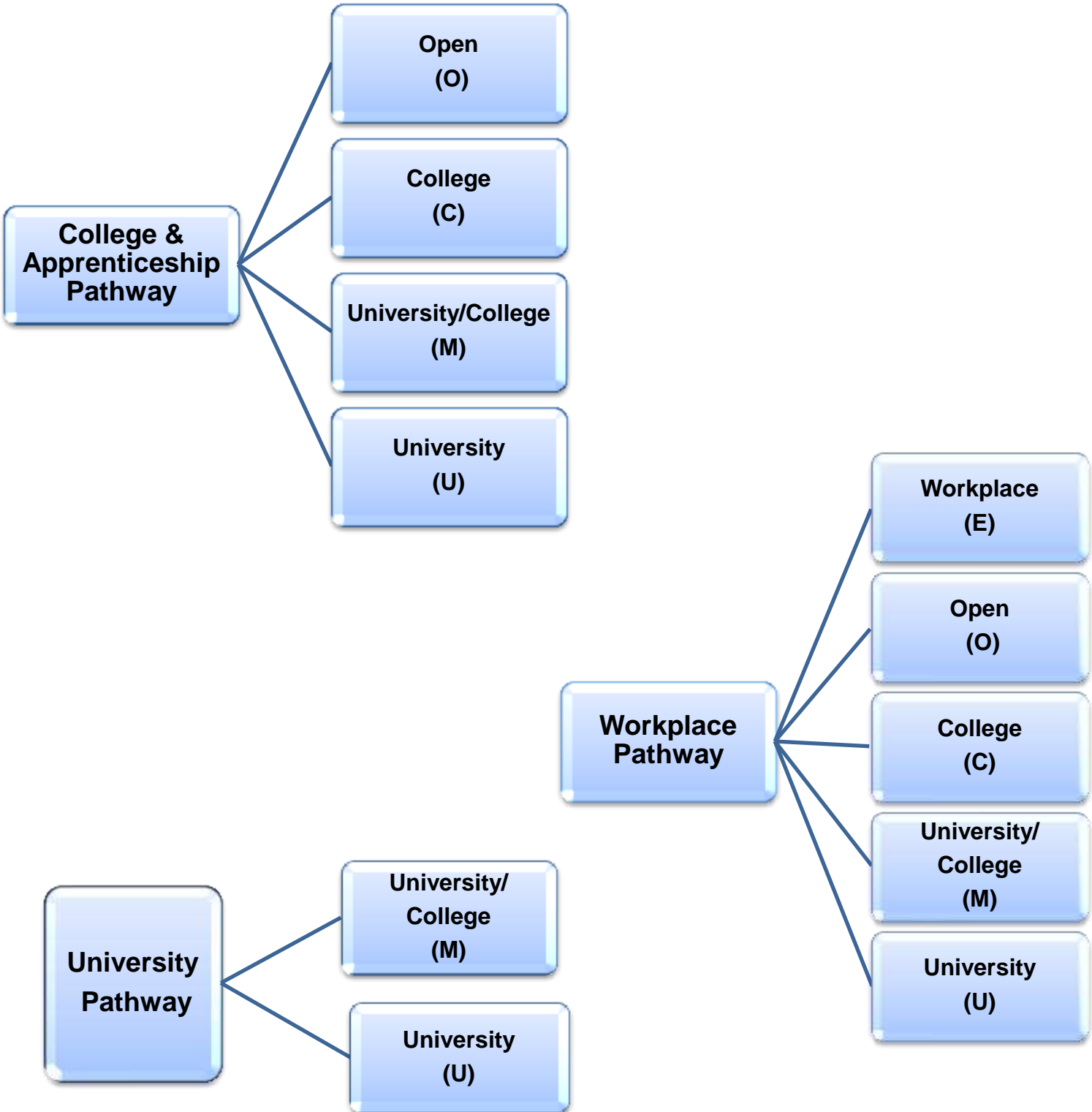
The remaining **elective/optional courses** should be made with the following in mind:

- Other diploma requirements (see the bottom of your Credit Counselling Summary). Check to see if there are any other compulsory courses you are missing; for example group 1, or group 2 or group 3.
- Check that you have the prerequisites for the courses you are interested in.
- Educational or employment plans; many post-secondary programs have specific course requirements BEYOND the completion of a diploma
