SO YOU'RE GOING INTO GRADE 10

Students moving from Grade 9 to Grade 10 must choose a total of 8 courses and 3 alternatives:

Regular Program – include 5 compulsory courses plus 3 elective courses and 3 alternative courses.

Immersion and Extended students – include 6 compulsory plus 2 elective courses and 3 alternative courses.

When choosing the codes for your compulsory courses keep in mind that the **5th and bolded** letter in each of the codes listed above indicates the **level** at which the course is offered. **D-** Academic, **P-** Applied, **L-** Locally Developed. **O-** Open is another level that many of the Grade 10 elective courses are offered at. Make sure you have the prerequisite for the courses you are choosing.

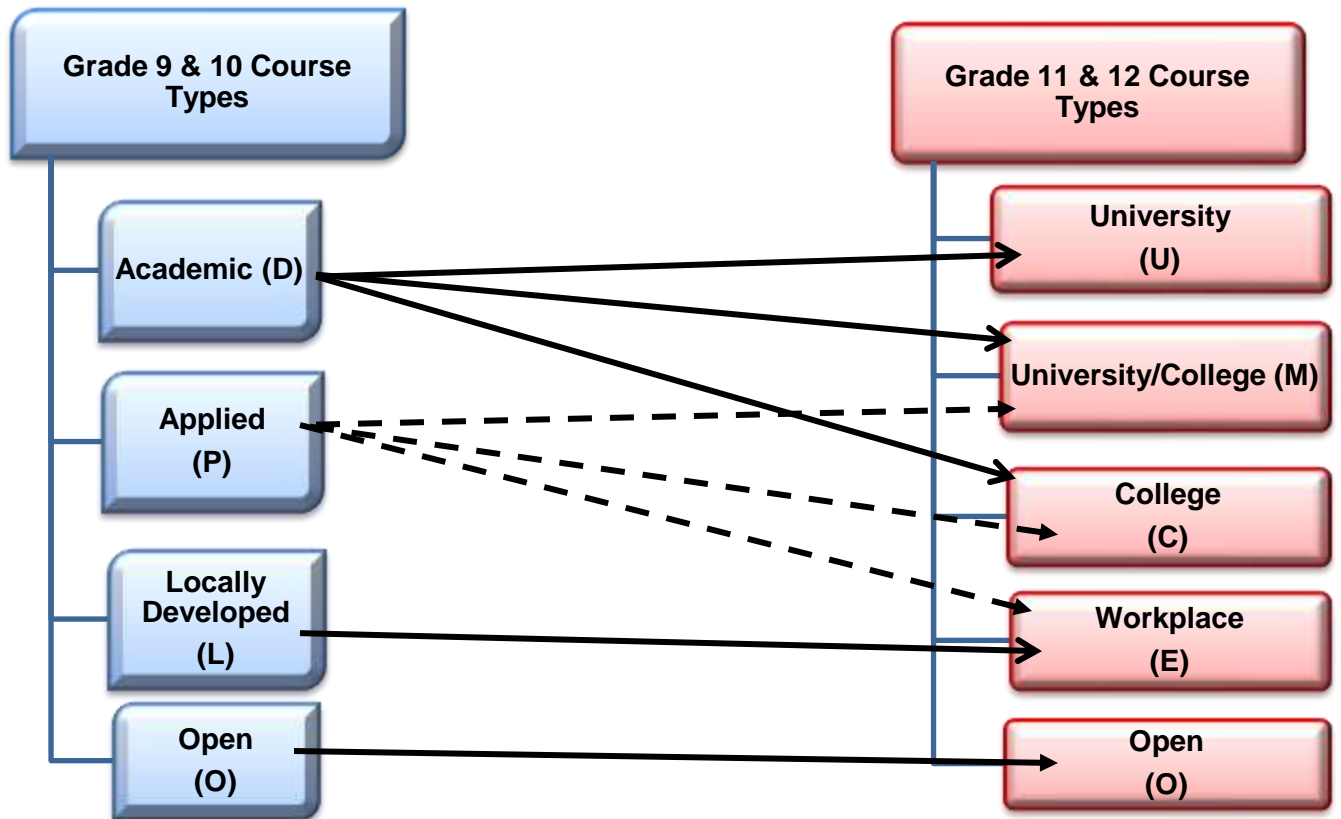
MATH rule: if you want to go from grade 9 applied math (MFM1P1) to grade 10 academic math (MPM2D1) you must take a **transfer credit course at summer school**.

If a student fails a grade 9 core course (English, Math, Science, Geography, French) than they need to put this into their timetable for next year. If they have a mark between 35 – 45% they can sign up for summer school and when the student has passed summer school their timetable for next year will be changed (i.e. put in the appropriate grade 10 course)

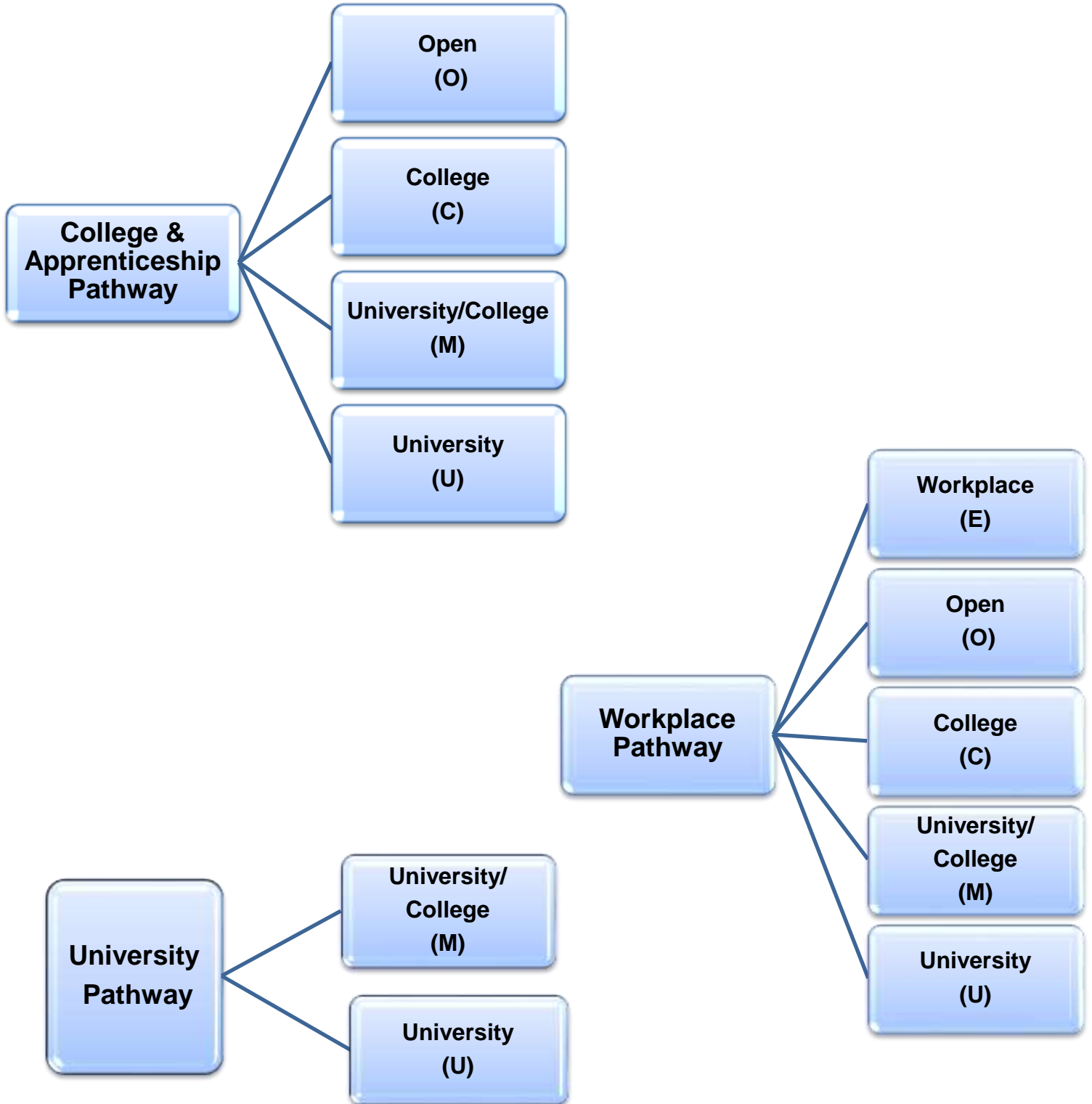
The remaining **elective courses and alternative courses** should be made with the following in mind:

- Other diploma requirements (see the bottom of your Credit Counselling Summary). Check to see if there are any other compulsory courses you are missing; for example group 1, or group 2 or group 3.
- Check that you have the prerequisites for the courses you are interested in.
- Your interests, your skills, and your career ideas.
